# Faith- πίστη

The First Sunday of the Great Lent - Sunday of Orthodoxy

Icon depicting the restoration of holy icons within the Eastern Orthodox Church



The first Sunday of Lent is called the Sunday of Orthodoxy. It is the day we celebrate the return of icons to the churches after a period where certain bishops attempted to ban them

by decreeing that the veneration of icons was idol worship. This decree marked the beginning of a long bloody battle against sacred images in the Eastern Church. Icons were destroyed or burned and their defenders cast into prison, exiled and even tortured. This battle lasted just over one hundred years, until 842 A.D. when Empress Theodora restored the use and veneration of icons. A synod at Constantinople was convoked which restored the veneration of holy images. The right way to use icons was defined, explaining that the icon is honoured or venerated, but not worshiped as an idol in itself.

On the first Sunday of the Great Lent the icons were brought back to the churches in solemn procession. That day is remembered as the triumph of Orthodoxy (tradition) over the iconoclasts (those who opposed the use of sacred images). Icons are important in that they affirm the principle of the Incarnation of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ—the Word of God made flesh.

The name of this Sunday reflects the great significance which icons possess for the Church. They are not optional devotional extras, but an integral part of our faith and devotion. They are held to be a necessary consequence of Christian faith in the incarnation of the Word of God, the Second Person of the Trinity, in Jesus Christ. They have a sacramental character, making present to the believer the person or event depicted on them. So the interior of our churches is often covered with icons painted on walls and domed roofs, and there is usually an icon screen, or iconostasis, separating the sanctuary from the nave, often with several rows of icons. Many of our homes have an icon corner where the family prays.

Orthodox Christians believe that he who sees Jesus sees the Father in him. The Father's invisible, but he becomes visible in his Son, who is his word, who is his image, who is his wisdom, who is his truth, who is his peace, who is his light, who is his life. He actually becomes flesh and becomes visible. Therefore, when you have an image of Jesus, you have an image of God becoming visible; that in the humanity of Jesus, you are given insight into the invisible character of God. The icon testifies to the incarnation of the Son of God, the real incarnation of the Son of God; that God really became a human being whose image can be depicted.

Revering the holy icons is proof that we confess that God became a describable person, that the Word of God was truly incarnated and became a person, but also that people truly become children of God and vessels of the Holy Spirit, temples of God and members of Christ. We revere the holy icons of the Saints and their holy relics because God dwelt in them. So we celebrate the restitution of the holy icons and have the blessed custom of carrying them in procession, of honouring and embracing the icons of Christ and Our Lady and the Saints of the Church.

Icons, hymns, prayers, worship and liturgy of the Orthodox Church focus our attention, our hearts, minds, and spirits on Jesus Christ: His person, His redeeming message, and divinity. Icons are windows into that holy realm where God and the saints now dwell. By beholding of the sacred icons, each liturgical year, it is believed that we see the unfolding of Our Salvation

# Student Recognition

One of our sixth form students has taken part in a Gresham college online course and she has shared her experience below:



Regarding the lectures mentioned on the Gresham College website, I decided to attend 'Sleep and Dreams' presented by Professor Glenn D Wilson. He started off by discussing the mysteries of sleep and the use of brain waves to determine the different stages of sleep in each individual. Professor Wilson then spoke about experiments concerning sleep deprivation and memory consolidation, demonstrating the significance of sleeping as it improves memory storage and cell growth for immune functioning. I found this information captivating and valuable considering how a lack of a routine could affect my studies. The Professor concluded with concerns about insomnia, hypnotics and its side effects, as well as theories and studies made by famous psychologists. I, also, liked the 'cybernetic theory' by Newman and Evans in 1965 which views dreams as by-products of the brain discarding and sorting important memories into appropriate files, again linking them closely to a memory consolidation process. - Eriola K, Year 12




# The STA Talent Show is back by popular demand

# COVID-19 updates- reminder

# Information for parents and carers on COVID-19 vaccination for at risk 5 to 11 year olds

Children aged 5 to 11 years who are in a clinical risk group or who live with someone who is immunosuppressed can get the COVID-19 vaccine, in line with advice set out by the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI). Eligible children include those with diabetes, immunosuppression, learning disabilities, and other conditions as outlined by the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) in the Green Book. Vaccinations help to increase protection against COVID-19, which is particularly important for those with underlying health conditions.

Further information is available in the guide for parents of children aged 5 to 11 years published by UKHSA. We have published some frequently asked questions on the vaccination programme including information on eligibility, accessibility and advice for parents of children at high risk from COVID-19. Following advice from the JCVI, healthy 5 to 11 year old children will also be offered two 10 microgram doses of the COVID-19 vaccine. The NHS will prepare to extend this non-urgent offer to all children during April.

#### **Update on the DfE COVID-19 Helpline**

Following the Prime Minister's Living with COVID-19 announcement on Monday 21 February, the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA), accessed through option 1 of the DfE COVID-19 helpline, will be decommissioned from Friday 1 April 2022. The UKHSA advice service was introduced in September 2020 to provide advice to education and childcare settings on the action they should take to respond to positive cases of COVID-19 in their setting.

The DfE COVID-19 helpline will continue to be available to answer your questions relating to COVID-19 in education, childcare and children's social care settings after the UKHSA advice service is decommissioned.

# Longer-term plans

From Thursday 24 March, the government will remove the Covid-19 provisions within the Statutory Sick Pay and Employment and Support Allowance regulations.

From Friday 1 April, the government will no longer provide free to order universal symptomatic and asymptomatic testing for the general public in England. The government will update guidance on the steps that people with Covid-19 should take to minimise contact with other people accordingly.
