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
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Faith



Nicholas the Wonderworker, Archbishop of Myra, Wednesday 6 December

This Saint lived during the reign of Saint Constantine the Great and reposed in 330. As a young man, he desired the solitary life. He made a pilgrimage to the holy city Jerusalem, where he found a place to withdraw to devote himself to prayer. Eventually God revealed that he should return to his homeland to be a cause of salvation for many. He returned to Myra and was ordained bishop. He became known for his abundant mercy, providing for the poor and needy, and delivering those who had been unjustly accused. No less was he known for his zeal for the truth. He was present at the First Ecumenical Council of the 318 Fathers at Nicaea in 325; upon hearing the blasphemies that Arius brazenly uttered against the Son of God, Saint Nicholas struck him on the face. Since the canons of the Church forbid the clergy to strike any man at all, his fellow bishops were in perplexity. In the night our Lord Jesus Christ and our Lady Theotokos appeared to certain of the bishops, informing them that no action was to be taken against him, since he had acted not out of passion, but out of extreme love and piety. St Nicholas is the patron of all travellers, and of sea-farers in particular; he is one of the best known and best loved Saints of all time, particularly because of his reputation for being kind to children and the needy; he embodies our core school value of caring.




