In school:


Students have 5 hours of English per week:



- Memorising quotes and context





Essential equipment – Core Texts

- Usual: black pen, green pen, Lit and Lang exercise books, highlighters.










At home: independent work

At home: Organising your study notes










How can you help your child in year 10?
