Dear Parents/Carers

Thank you for your support as we approach the final week of end-of-year exams, with Year 9 set to follow the excellent example set by Year 7, 8, 10 and 12. STA students have impressed their teachers by their sensible and dedicated approach to their exams with impeccable conduct throughout the exam series. Year 10 and Year 12 students will receive their results this week and teachers are entering data in preparation for reports to be sent home to you in the week beginning Monday 12 July.

All students will receive detailed feedback about their exam performance from their teachers. I have asked all teachers to set follow-up activities including homework exercises designed to close any gaps that have been identified.

Please do complete the [parent/ carer survey](#) on homework as your feedback will help to guide our future provision. I am happy to extend the deadline for your responses to 3pm on Wednesday 30 June.

I am sorry to announce that we have had to amend our detailed plans for events in this half term including our summer school catch-up programme planned for the summer holiday. Thank you for your understanding and patience regarding these necessary changes of plan which are all related to the national COVID picture. The safety of students and staff remains paramount in our decision-making process.

We have been able to replan the day in school on 1 July for our new Year 7 cohort so that students will arrive in a school bubble or they will receive an individual appointment. We are planning to go ahead with our Year 5 in school days as each school will arrive on an allocated day and they will remain in their Year 5 class bubbles for the duration of the day. We are also going ahead with our planned visits to St Katherine's Greek Orthodox Church where we will have a Year group assembly. Of course, we will keep all remaining events under review.

I am pleased to share the details of our forthcoming Sports Interform Competitions in place of our previously planned Sports day. The PE team have risk assessed the activities below so that we are COVID-safe..



Faith- Sunday of All Saint

The Sunday following Pentecost, we celebrate the feast of All Saints. The Orthodox Church chose to dedicate the first Sunday after Pentecost to all the saints as commemoration and recognition of the Holy Spirit.



On this feast day, the Church honours all saints, not only those who have been consecrated, or officially had their holiness proclaimed by the church, those whose names are present in the church calendar and their biographies (the life of Saints), but also the unknown ones, as there are many unknown saints to us, but are known before God.

It is said, "No one was born a saint, but everyone is called to holiness." This is the teaching of the Church and the Holy Bible. In the Old Testament, we read in the book of Leviticus: "For I am the LORD your God: ye shall therefore sanctify yourselves, and ye shall be holy; for I am holy" (Leviticus 11:44).

Holiness is synonymous with perfection, according to Jesus' words: "Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect" (Matthew 5:48). Making holiness a goal as a Christian may seem difficult, or perhaps almost impossible. Some believe it a vocation exclusive to those who are in the priesthood or monasteries, but through the experience and the teaching of the Church, the opposite is true, that this vocation is the supreme goal of every Christian person, and that the invitation to achieve perfection is from God to all; it belongs to everyone.

St. Paul the Apostle explains that God has chosen us "in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before him in love," (Ephesians 1: 4). And in his letter to the Thessalonians he suggests "God hath from the beginning chosen you to salvation through sanctification of the Spirit and belief of the truth" (2 Thess. 2:13).

The Lord Jesus reveals to His disciples how a believer can seek holiness through several commandments that must be followed.

The first condition: It is the confession of Jesus "before men". This is a clear and explicit confession of faith that Jesus Christ is the Son of God and the Saviour of the world. This confession is not only expressed verbally, but also in deeds. The Apostle Paul says: "That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved," (Romans 9:10).

The second condition is love: "He that loveth father or mother more than me is not worthy of me: and he that loveth son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me." Here, the Lord Jesus sets the scale of love. He asks that He be

at the height of our priority. He does not exclude family and relatives from this love, as He does not say love me and hate your father or mother (or your son or daughter) but says: "Whoever loves a father or mother (son or daughter) more than me, he does not deserve me." The Lord Jesus seeks to possess the full love of the disciple.

And the third condition: "He takes his cross and follows me." Here, He exhorts followers to bear witness even unto martyrdom. That is, the confession of Him and love for Him will lead to a type of martyrdom.

So that no one would think that what was said applied only to the disciples, Christ broadened the promise to include everyone who does likewise. He says, "**And everyone that hath forsaken houses, or brethren, or sisters, or father, or mother, or wife, or children, or lands, for my name's sake, shall receive an hundredfold, and shall inherit everlasting life.**" The Lord Jesus promised His disciples and everyone who follow Him also that if they left everything for His name, they would receive in this life a hundredfold, and then he would inherit eternal life.

"Come, ye believers, let us today stand in rank and celebrate with true worship; let us exalt with glorifications the memorial of all-honoured, all-revered saints, shouting, Rejoice, O glorious Apostles, Prophets, Martyrs and Bishops! Rejoice, O company of the righteous and just! Rejoice, O rank of honoured women! Supplicate ye Christ to grant the king victory over the Barbarians, and our souls the Great Mercy." Amen.

Message- The Education Welfare Officer (EWO)

My name is Rosana Hermosa and I am the new Education Welfare Officer for St Andrew the Apostle School. I work alongside school staff to support attendance and punctuality and identify pupils who fall below the 96% attendance expected by the school and Barnet's Education Welfare Team for students to achieve their educational potential.

When a student falls below 90% attendance they are considered a persistent absentee. I have a duty to secure children's education and ensure attendance is kept to expectations. I enjoy working with families and the school in supporting students with their good attendance.

If your child falls below these expectations, or has unauthorised absences on their record, I will invite you to a

meeting to discuss the reasons and agree actions for attendance to improve. When reasons are not valid there are a range of Sanctions used by the Education Welfare Team. These include Education Supervision Orders; Fixed Penalty Notices and Prosecution at Magistrates' Court.

Please remember that all absences during term time must be authorised by the school. Term time holidays are never permitted. Fixed-penalty Notices are also issued for unauthorised lateness to school. Parents and carers need to be aware that arrival to school after the official close of the register, without good reason, is recorded as an unauthorised absence.

If you are concerned about your own child's attendance, please speak to the school or ask to arrange a meeting with me. I am very much looking forward to working with students, parents and the school community.


